It is hoped that a transcript-recognized minor option in Art History will help with institutional four-year graduation rates, in that students may, in the future, select the transcript-recognized minor option instead of staying additional semesters to complete a simultaneous major and earn a second degree in Art History. The Art History minor will be available to students whose degree programs in other colleges require a transcripted minor.

### PROPOSED NEW CATALOG TEXT:

#### **Theatre Studies Major**

### **Major Requirements**

- 1. Theatre and dance core: Eighteen semester hours, consisting of Theatre and Dance 311<u>C</u>, 313C, [314C] 314M, [314P], 314Q, 317C, and 317D
- 2. Theatre studies emphasis: At least thirty-three semester hours, consisting of
  - a. Acting and directing: Theatre and Dance 313D, [323C], 316D, and 323D
  - b. Design and technical production: [Theatre and Dance 314M; and nine] six semester hours chosen from topics of Theatre and Dance 324 or 354T, including one course in [each] two of the following three areas: costume, lighting, and scenery
  - c. Theatre studies: Theatre and Dance 326C, 326D, 326Q, and [326E] 626E
  - d. Theatre and Dance 351T (Topic: Creative Drama II)
- 3. [Nine] Six additional upper-division semester hours of coursework in theatre and dance, [of which at least six hours must be upper division, with no more than three hours in] excluding production courses Several of the courses which may be used to complete requirement 1 are also approved to fulfill the visual and performing arts requirement of the core curriculum and may be used to fulfill both.

### **Approved Electives**

[Eighteen] Twenty-four semester hours of coursework approved by the theatre studies adviser. Additional elective coursework may be needed to provide the total number of semester hours required for the degree.

#### **Total Minimum Requirements**

For the BFA with a major in theatre studies: 120 semester hours as outlined above.
