PROPOSAL TO CREATE A TRANSCRIPT-RECOGNIZED CERTIFICATE IN JAPANESE IN THE COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS CHAPTER IN THE UNDERGRADUATE CATALOG, 2016-2018

Dean Randy L. Diehl, in the College of Liberal Arts has filed with the secretary of the Faculty Council the following addition to the *Undergraduate Catalog*, 2016-2018.
