This is a reminder of the next meeting of the C-6 Committee meeting at 1:15 next Monday, December 5. Quite a few items have been added to the UT Box location for the C-6 Committee. These items include:

- * An example of the format for a possible UT survey of international programs
- * A set of more complete answers to some of the international programs at the LBJ School and at the Institute for Innovation, Creativity and Capital (IC2), with some spaces left for programs where data are being compiled
- * A statement regarding current insurance products (as of 11/15/16) available through the UT System that are germane to international programs
- * A statement of two unresolved issues regarding insurance, as of 11/15/16 (which is now out of date, given the item below), but which should be discussed anyhow
- * A copy of a draft policy proposed by UT Systems that resolves the issue of faculty liability for international programs (we can discuss its importance next week)
- * A list of the department chairs for the pilot program of Campus Ambassadors
- * A list of the undergraduate advisors for the possible pilot program for Campus Ambassadors
- * Minutes from the November 2016 meeting of the C-6 Committee, with an enclosed agenda for the December C-6 meeting included

Two outcomes of the December meeting could be (a) a decision as to whether to start a pilot program for the Campus Ambassadors and (b) a decision on how to document current insurance coverages and how to make such information available to faculty who may lead international programs. We will also have an opportunity

to discuss faculty responsibilities for student welfare on international programs, as a step in developing a statement for faculty as to those responsibilities.
