- 5. <u>Twelve 12</u> semester hours <u>of upper-division coursework in management ehosen from the following courses: Management 325, 337 (any topic), 340S, 366P (may be used to satisfy this requirement or the internship requirement, but not both), 367P (may be used to satisfy this requirement or the internship requirement, but not both) \*see note below</u>
- 6. Six semester hours of upper-division coursework in social science (anthropology, economics, government, history, linguistics, geography, psychology, sociology)
- 7. Additional elective coursework, if necessary, to provide a total of at least 120 semester hours

The following topics of Management 337 are recommended: Groups and Teams, Topic 9: Leadership Issues,
