#### PROPOSED NEW CATALOG TEXT:4

The Undergraduate Minor in Disability Studies (DS) is an interdisciplinary course of study for students seeking a baccalaureate degree. The DS minor expands the theoretical framework of the medical model, and examines disability from a variety of individual, environmental, and social constructs with a focus on cross-disciplinary (versus discipline-specific) content. Disability Studies addresses the critical analysis of the nature, meaning, and social context of disability that encourages a broad understanding of the experience of disability by both individuals and the larger society. The DS minor provides an opportunity for students who are interested in disability, but are not involved in a human service professional programs, to pursue this interest in an organized manner.

### **DISABILITY STUDIES TRACK:**

The requirement for the Disability Studies Track are:

- 1. Fifteen semester hours, consisting of:
  - a. SW 325, Foundations of Social Justice (Online)
  - b. SW 360 K, Introduction to Disability Studies (Online): The Social Context of Disability
  - c. SW 360 K, Introduction to Disability Studies (Online): Making Systems Work for People with Disabilities
  - d. Six hours chosen from ALD 322, ANT 302, ANT 349C, CSD 306K, CSD 308K, E 376M, EDP 376T, N347, SED 303, SW311—I, KIN 352Ks, and KIN 360 or additional Disability Studies courses from SW 360K numbered courses
- 2. All courses in the DS Track must be taken on a letter grade basis, and students must earn a minimum grade of a C.
