- 2. EXPLAIN CHANGE TO DEGREE PROGRAM AND GIVE A DETAILED RATIONALE FOR **EACH INDIVIDUAL CHANGE:** 
  - 1. Replacing ALD 326 Language of Children with and without Disabilities with EDC 370E (Topic 20: Teaching English as a Second Language) as part of their required courses. Rationale: More school districts are now requiring Special Education teachers to have some ESL training so adding the EDC 370E ESL class to the Special Education certification program is ideal preparation and also makes it consistent with the rest of our certification programs which already require the ESL class. The content from ALD 326 is already being covered in other courses or will be covered in other courses.
  - 2. Replacing ALD 328 Applied Human Learning with SED 378 Teaching Math to Students with Disabilities as part of their required courses. Rationale: The Special Education Faculty have been hearing from a large number of school districts that more math preparation is needed for Special Education majors, so they created SED 378 Teaching Math to Students with Disabilities. The content from ALD 328 is already being covered in other

# BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN APPLIED LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

## **All-Level Generic Special Education**

Students who have completed the all-level generic special education major are eligible to teach in special education classrooms from pre-kindergarten through grade twelve after meeting additional state requirements. For this major, students must complete the following:

- 1. Coursework in applied learning and development and related areas:
  - a. Three semester hours in human development chosen from Human Development and Family Sciences 313 and Psychology 304
  - b. Three semester hours in cognition and learning chosen from Applied Learning and Development 320 and 321
  - c. Applied Learning and Development 322, [326,] 327, [and 328]
- 2. Prescribed work in special education: Special Education 332, 337, 372, 375C, 376, <u>378, 378D</u>, 378E, 378R, and 378S
- 3. The Professional Development Sequence described below. Admission to the Professional Development Sequence is restricted; admission requirements are given in Admission to the Professional Development Sequence.
  - a. Curriculum and Instruction 370E (Topic 5: *Mathematics*), 370E (Topic 1: *Reading*), [and] 370E (Topic 2: *Language Arts*), and EDC 370E (Topic 20: Teaching English as a Second Language.

#### BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN KINESIOLOGY AND HEALTH

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#### **Applied Movement Science**

Applied movement science majors must complete the following:

- 1. The Prescribed Work, with the following modifications:
  - a. <u>To fulfill the mathematics requirement, Applied Movement Science majors must complete</u> Mathematics 305G or calculus. <u>Mathematics 305G and several calculus courses may also</u> be counted toward the mathematics requirement of the core curriculum.
  - [a.] b. Applied movement science majors do not need to complete a course to fulfill the second part of the social science requirement (Prescribed Work 2b)
  - [b.] <u>c.</u> In fulfilling the natural science requirement, the student must complete the following:
    - i. In place of Biology 301L or 311C: Three hours in one of the fields of study that may be counted toward the science and technology, part II, requirement of the Core Curriculum.

#### **Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and Health**

The field of kinesiology consists of biomechanical, physiological, psychological, managerial, epidemiological, rehabilitative, and sociocultural approaches to the study of human movement and personal and public health. The Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and Health degree program offers five majors: <u>applied movement</u> <u>science</u>, exercise science, <u>health promotion and behavioral science</u>, physical culture and sports, [health promotion], and sport management[, and applied movement science].

The applied movement science program is designed for students interested in studying human movement as a background for helping others develop motor skills, physically active lifestyles and fitness. Students who successfully complete the [program] physical activity education track can be recommended for teacher certification in physical education. The exercise science program is appropriate preparation for further study in sport and exercise sciences or in movement-related areas such as physical therapy and sport medicine. The [health promotion] health promotion and behavioral science major is designed to prepare graduates for a number of professions [involving] including [wellness, fitness, rehabilitation, public health, and disease

prevention] public health, community health promotion, university/college health services, government agencies, voluntary health agencies, corporate fitness and wellness, and healthcare centers. ### BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN KINESIOLOGY AND HEALTH

#### Health Promotion and Behavioral Science

Health promotion and behavioral science majors must complete the following:

- 1. The Prescribed Work above, with the following modifications:
  - a. Health Promotion and Behavioral Science majors do not need to complete the six additional hours of natural sciences (Prescribed Work 4c).
  - b. Communication Studies 306M
- 2. <u>Eighteen [18]</u> semester hours in the cognate in health promotion:
  - a. Health Education 343
  - b. Health Education 350
  - c. Health Education 351
  - d. Health Education 373
  - e. Six hours of [health promotion] <u>health promotion and behavioral science</u> electives; approved courses available in the Student Dean's Office, George I. Sánchez Building 216 and in [the Kinesiology Advising Center,] Bellmont Hall 1005
- 3. Either a specialization in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Education, a minor outside the department, a certificate, or a track in a second field of study which consist of a minimum of [15] <u>fifteen</u> hours of coursework, six of which must be upper-division. No more than six hours in the minor may also be counted toward other degree requirements. Information about approved areas of study and specific courses that may be used is available in the Student Dean's Office, George I. Sánchez Building 216 and [in the Kinesiology Advising Center,] Bellmont Hall 1005.

### PROPOSAL TO CREATE A KINESIOLOGY AND HEALTH EDUCATION MINOR IN THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION CHAPTER IN THE UNDERGRADUATE CATALOG 2018-2020

Dean Manuel J. Justiz in the College of Education has filed with the Secretary of the Faculty Council the following proposal to create a Kinesiology and Health Education minor in the College of Education chapter in the *Undergraduate Catalog*, 2018-2020. On February 14, 2017, the Kinesiology and Health Education (KHE) Undergraduate Advisory Committee approved the proposal; it was approved by the College of Education Curriculum Committee on March 20, 2017; and by Dean Justiz on September 27, 2017. The Secretary has classified this proposal as legislation of exclusive interest to more than one college or school.

The Committee on Undergraduate Degree Program Review recommended approval of the proposal on March 7, 2018, and forwarded it to the Office of the General Faculty. The Faculty Council has the authority to approve this legislation on behalf of the General Faculty. The authority to grant final approval on this legislation resides with the Provost on behalf of the President.

If no objection is filed with the Office of the General Faculty by the date specified below, the legislation will be held to have been approved by the Faculty Council. If an objection is filed within the prescribed period, the legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council at its next meeting. The objection, with reasons, must be signed by a member of the Faculty Council.

To be counted, a protest must be received in the Office of the General Faculty by March 27, 2018.
