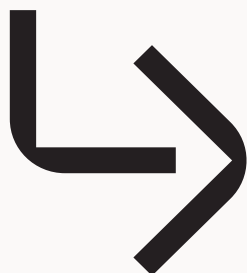

The Master of Arts in Design focused on Health at UT Austin is one of the only programs in the world where students train deeply in design specifically in a health context.

40 Credits

The program is delivered over 3 semesters—summer, fall, and spring. The 40 credit hours include 26 credits in foundational design coursework and 14 credits in health-related coursework offered in collaboration with Dell Medical School's Design Institute for Health. Graduates of the MA in Design program are well-equipped to research and interpret human needs and systematic forces in the health sector in order to create improved patient experiences, more effective processes, innovative services, and higher quality care.

All areas of expertise are welcome in this interdisciplinary, in-residence program. The University is located in the center of Austin, a hub for technology-driven jobs in the aptly named Silicon Hills, leveraging creative and technology ecosystems to give our students hands-on experiences with real-world scenarios in their classes.
