District and School Benefits:

- Collaboration with the district/campus leaders to choose an area of focus for the study.
- The opportunity to receive:
 - A written case study report based on state-level longitudinal data, community interviews, climate surveys and an analysis of the campus and district artifacts
 - PowerPoint presentation of the research question, literature review, data collection findings, research based recommendations
 - o Oral presentation of the findings for your district and campus leadership team and/or faculty

District and School Commitments:

- Provide UT Austin Principal Residents and Interns access by May for the following documents:
 - o Campus Improvement Plan
 - o Multilingual Education, Special Education, 504, GT, Dyslexia, etc... procedures and systems
 - o Sample of a CAC agenda
 - Student and Staff handbook outlining expectations and systems

 - Climate Survey Data for faculty, staff, students and families

 - Faculty and Parent Sign Up Sheet for interviews in June (See attachments).

- Provide learning opportunities for aspiring principals to conduct an in depth strengths and needs assessment
 of a local school using the District and Campus Improvement Plans, Leadership Framework aligned to the
 Texas Principal Standards
- Conduct and apply relevant research to the data findings with a focus on inclusive practices
- Recommend possible actions for the school leadership teams and the faculty to pursue

University of Texas Principal Interna and Resident Program Commitments:

- Comply with the Program and Evaluation Department's district process for conducting research
- Maintain confidentiality
- Analyze the data artifacts provided by the principal and develop interview questions aligned to the artifact analysis for district and campus leaders, teachers, staff, parent and community members
- Conduct interviews
- Conduct a community walk
- Conduct a literature review to identify research based recommendations
- Triangulate the data to find themes and conduct a literature review to make recommendations based on research.
- Provide a written report, PowerPoint presentation and oral presentation for the district and campus leadership team at the end of July or early August (based on the district's availability).
- Provide a presentation to the faculty in late August and early September (optional)
