


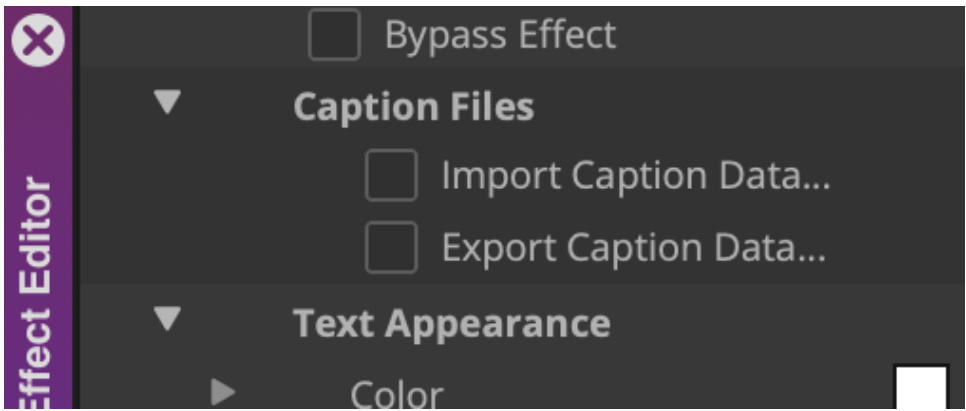


AVID - Captions - How to Export Out of SubCap Tool
